## REPORT OF THE NOMINATIONS COMMITTEE

### ELECTION OF OFFICERS

The ANNUAL ELECTION OF OFFICERS is held at the Annual Dinner Meeting. The Annual Dinner, this year, is scheduled for Saturday, March 18, 1989. See announcement in this issue of the BUSHWACK BULLETIN.

The BY-LAWS of the Club provide for the election as follows:

#### BY-LAW I - ELECTION AND QUALIFICATION OF OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS:

Section 1 - NOMINATIONS: The President shall appoint a Nominating Committee, which shall be chaired by a non-officer member of the Board of Directors, not later than sixty [60] days before the next succeeding Annual Meeting. The Nominating Committee shall notify all Club Members at least thirty [30] days before the Annual Meeting of the nominated persons. The Nominating Committee is limited to one nomination for each office and non-officer directorship. Additional nominations, which are reserved to the membership at large, may be submitted in writing to the Nominating Committee, until one week prior to the Annual Meeting. No nominations are to be made nor accepted from the floor at the Annual Meeting.

Section 2 - ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND NON-OFFICER DIRECTORS: Election shall be at the Annual Meeting. If there are more than one nominee for any office or non-officer directorship, the election shall be by secret ballot and by plurality vote.

Section 3 - TERM OF OFFICE: Officers shall be elected annually, but the President and Vice-President shall in no event serve more than two consecutive terms in their respective offices. The Secretary and Treasurer may serve successive one year terms without limitation. Non-officer members of the Board of Directors shall be elected by class to serve a two year term, but they shall in no event serve more than two consecutive elected terms.

In accordance with the Constitution and By-Laws of the SUSQUEHANNA APPALACHIAN TRAIL CLUB, the Nominating Committee, appointed by the President, submits the following slate of officers for your consideration for the coming year:

## FROM THE PRESIDENT

[My apologies to our President, since she sent me a very nice article on the Peters Mountain Shelter, and I managed to misplace it, as well as the Trail Blazes article on Whiskey Spring.]

The gist of Thyra's article was that the new shelter is almost finished, except for some siding, and a little interior work. It is already in use, and those using it have had high praises of the structure.

Work trips are being planned to complete the work as soon as the weather breaks, along with starting work on the new privy. The privy will be a composting type, and is being pre-fabricated by some of the members, so that it can be hauled in in sections and assembled on site, when the weather becomes a bit milder.

The Darlington Trail has had to be cut back from the River to Tower Road, due to development. The remaining ten miles or so is badly in need of maintenance. By breaking the remaining trail up in sections of approximately one mile, and assigning it to about ten members should make maintenance much simpler. We already have one volunteer so about nine more are needed to help maintain this trail.

# OUR FAVORITE HIKES NO. 28 - STATE HOSPITAL / WILDWOOD LAKE

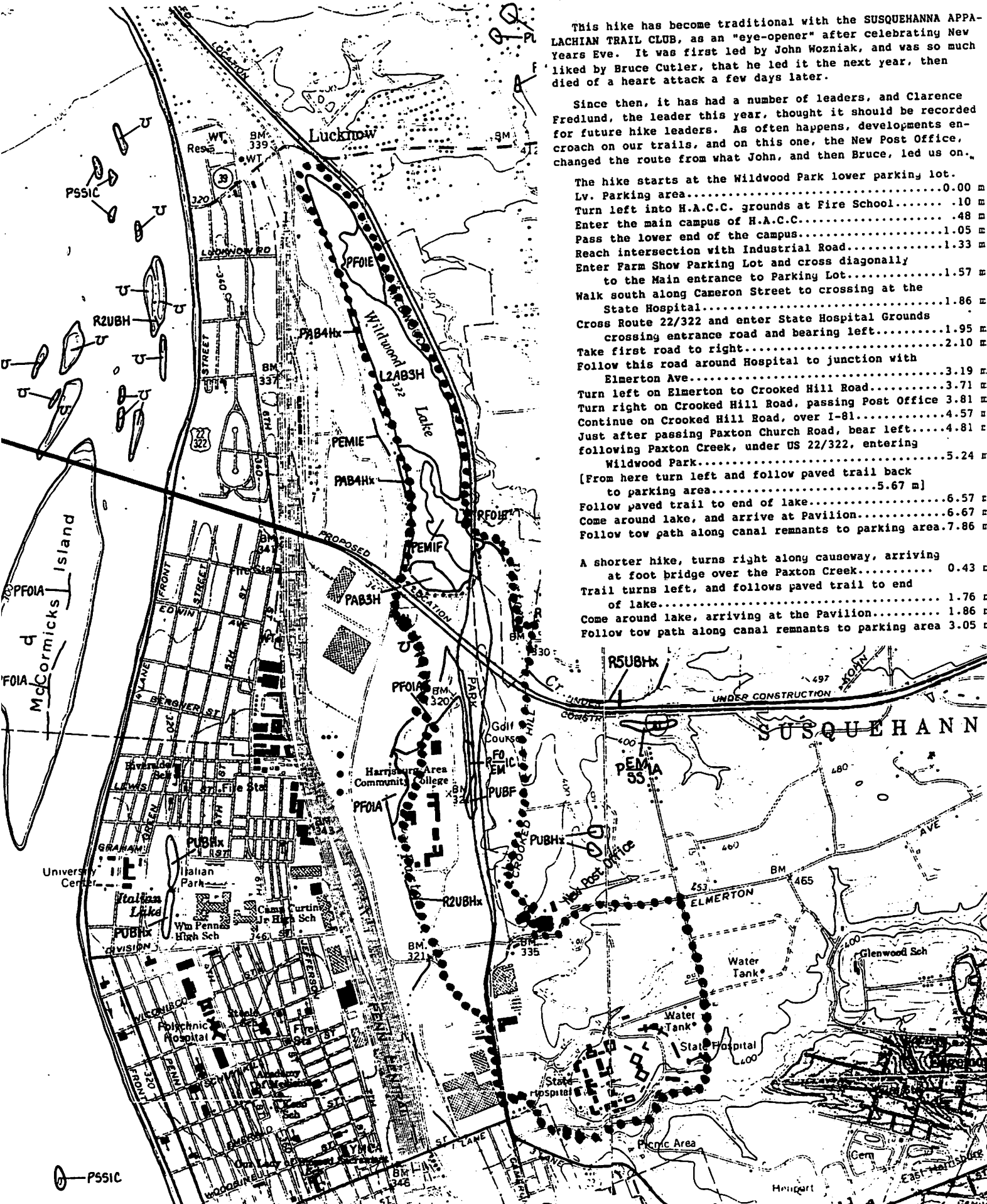

This hike has become traditional with the SUSQUEHANNA APPALACHIAN TRAIL CLUB, as an "eye-opener" after celebrating New Years Eve. It was first led by John Wozniak, and was so much liked by Bruce Cutler, that he led it the next year, then died of a heart attack a few days later.

Since then, it has had a number of leaders, and Clarence Fredlund, the leader this year, thought it should be recorded for future hike leaders. As often happens, developments encroach on our trails, and on this one, the New Post Office, changed the route from what John, and then Bruce, led us on.

- The hike starts at the Wildwood Park lower parking lot.
- Lv. Parking area.....0.00 m
  - Turn left into H.A.C.C. grounds at Fire School..... .10 m
  - Enter the main campus of H.A.C.C..... .48 m
  - Pass the lower end of the campus.....1.05 m
  - Reach intersection with Industrial Road.....1.33 m
  - Enter Farm Show Parking Lot and cross diagonally to the Main entrance to Parking Lot.....1.57 m
  - Walk south along Cameron Street to crossing at the State Hospital.....1.86 m
  - Cross Route 22/322 and enter State Hospital Grounds crossing entrance road and bearing left.....1.95 m
  - Take first road to right.....2.10 m
  - Follow this road around Hospital to junction with Elmerton Ave.....3.19 m
  - Turn left on Elmerton to Crooked Hill Road.....3.71 m
  - Turn right on Crooked Hill Road, passing Post Office 3.81 m
  - Continue on Crooked Hill Road, over I-81.....4.57 m
  - Just after passing Paxton Church Road, bear left.....4.81 m
  - following Paxton Creek, under US 22/322, entering Wildwood Park.....5.24 m
  - [From here turn left and follow paved trail back to parking area.....5.67 m]
  - Follow paved trail to end of lake.....6.57 m
  - Come around lake, and arrive at Pavilion.....6.67 m
  - Follow tow path along canal remnants to parking area 7.86 m

- A shorter hike, turns right along causeway, arriving at foot bridge over the Paxton Creek..... 0.43 m
- Trail turns left, and follows paved trail to end of lake..... 1.76 m
  - Come around lake, arriving at the Pavilion..... 1.86 m
  - Follow tow path along canal remnants to parking area 3.05 m
