NEW A.T. MAP NOW AVAILABLE

A new map for Sections 7 & 8 in the Pennsylvania A.T. Guidebook has just been published by the Keystone Trails Association.

This new map is a multi-colored, topographical version, printed on a tear and moisture resistant material, on a scale of 1 inch = 1 mile. As a result, this map covers about 33 miles, from the Susquehanna River to Swatara Gap. It also includes many other hiking trails in the local area.

This new map was developed by the K.T.A. Maps and Guidebook Committee, with local S.A.T.C. member, Tom Scully contributing much time and effort in scouting out and measuring the many trails and plotting natural features, historic sites, and such areas as are available to the public for hiking.

CHAINSAW SAFETY WORKSHOP

The Appalachian Trail Conference will sponsor a chainsaw safety workshop to be held at the "Scott Farm" in Cumberland County on the weekend of March 8 & 9, 1997. The Scott Farm is the headquarters of the Mid-Atlantic A.T. Crew and serves other trail volunteer activities.

This very worthwhile workshop will be given by retired professional logger Jeff Putnam. Anyone that currently uses a chainsaw in trail maintenance work or those interested in training to use one for that purpose should seriously consider attending this two day workshop. Proper safety techniques for cutting as well as proper chainsaw maintenance will be thoroughly discussed.

REPORT OF THE NOMINATIONS COMMITTEE

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

The Annual Election of Officers is held at the Annual Dinner Meeting. The Annual Dinner Meeting, this year, is scheduled for Saturday, March 22, 1997. See announcement in this issue of the BUSHWACK BULLETIN.

The BY-LAWS of the Club provide for the election as follows:

BY-LAW I - ELECTION AND QUALIFICATIONS OF OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS

- Section 1 - **NOMINATIONS:** The President shall appoint a Nominating Committee, which shall be chaired by a non-officer member of the Board of Directors, not later than sixty (60) days before the next succeeding Annual Meeting. The Nominating Committee shall notify all Club Members at least thirty (30) days before the Annual Meeting of the nominated persons. The Nominating Committee is limited to one nomination for each office and non-officer directorship. Additional nominations, which are reserved to the membership at large, may be submitted in writing to the Nominating Committee, until one week prior to the Annual Meeting. No nominations are to be accepted from the floor at the Annual Meeting.
- Section 2 - **ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND NON-OFFICER DIRECTORS:** Election shall be at the Annual Meeting. If there are more than one nominee for any office or non-officer directorship, the election shall be by secret ballot and by plurality vote.
- Section 3 - **TERM OF OFFICE:** Officers shall be elected annually, but the President and Vice-President shall in no event serve more than two consecutive terms in their respective offices. The Secretary and Treasurer may serve successive one year terms without limitation. Non-officer members of the Board of Directors shall be elected by class to serve a two year term, but they shall in no event serve more than two consecutive elected terms.
